**Motorbaby** is lead singer/guitarist/writer Sharon Middendorf, bassist and producer Ron Mancuso and drummer Lez Warner. Born out of New York's Lower East Side, Motorbaby plays a mix of grinding laconic pop spiked with dreamy ambient churn and dark, undulating grooves.



The 12 songs on the eponymously titled album are fueled by a moody bliss of a heart that believes in itself...from the deep groove and lush melodies of "Keep On" to the hook laden, inspired buzz of "Lose Your Mind."



Anyone seeking a true definition for "pop" needs only to listen to **Ask Anybody**, the effervescent debut from **Swirl 360**, a pop/rock duo from Jacksonville, Florida featuring brothers Kenny and Denny Scott.



As you listen to **Ask Anybody**, you'll be blown away at Swirl 360's ability to render one hit song after the next. A hallmark of Swirl 360's songcraft is their positive realism—they don't deny the difficulties of life and love, they just choose to put an upbeat spin on things. There's the irresistible first single, "Hey Now Now," the blissfully sublime "I'll Take My Chances," and the innocent sexuality of "Don't Shake My World." The freewheeling "Candy In The Sun" marries classic songwriting with 21st century electronica, and the bittersweet ballad "There" reveals the brothers' romantic side. You'll have trouble deciding which song on the album is your favorite.

Savage, savvy and brutally tongue-in-cheek, **2 Skinnee J's** provide the long-awaited soundtrack for the common folk, a celebration for every man/woman/android. "The Whammy," from their non-stop, full-on debut full-length **Supermercado**, spews forth a non-stop flow on rapacious rapping, poignant ranting, chewy grooves, astral squall and demonically possessed turntables. On stage, these Brooklyn boyezez are a blur of feathered boas, space suits and unruly lapels as seen on their many tours with Sugar Ray, The Urge, Tribe Called Quest, George Clinton & The P-Funk All-Stars, Diz Markee and Coolio.
