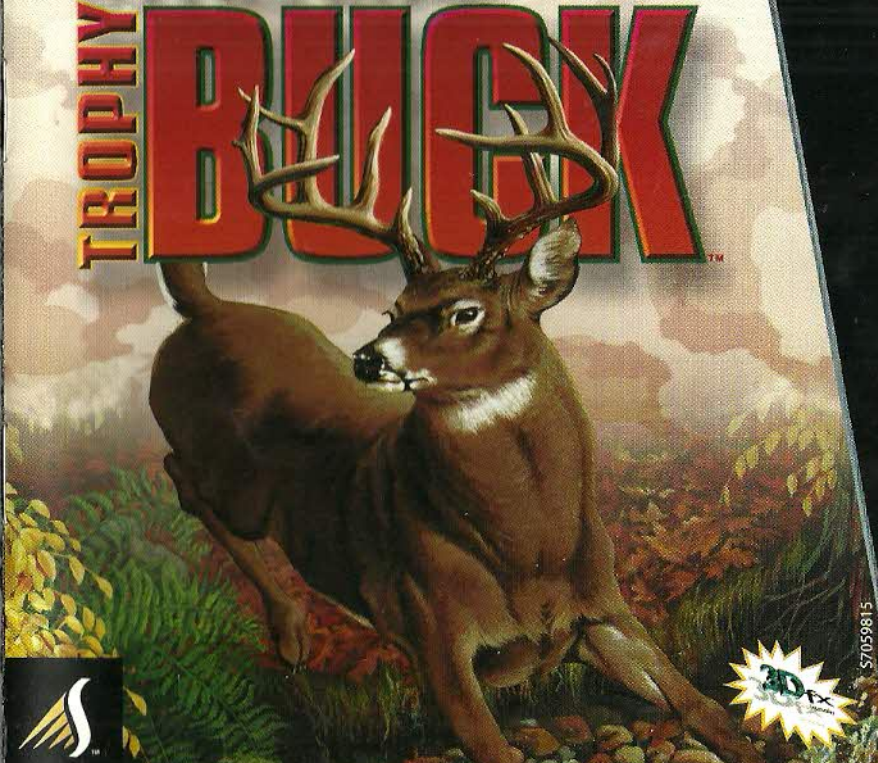

## About This Manual

Welcome to the *Field & Stream*® *Trophy Buck*™ Installation Guide. This booklet shows you how to get the game installed and running, and provides a brief overview. Once you start *Field & Stream*® *Trophy Buck*, you'll find several kinds of built-in help to answer any game play questions you might have:

- Click the **Preview** button on the Main Menu for a guided tour of the game's main features.
- Press F1 or click **Help** to open the on-line manual for the Trophy Buck game. This shows you how to get the most out of all the game features and windows
- Select **How To** from the Main Menu to open your multimedia deer hunting guidebook.
- Click on the TIPS button to get a Pro hunting tip based on the current field conditions.
- For help with the World Opponent Network (won.net) with Internet games, refer to the **won.net** section of the On-line manual.

## Installing and Starting the Game

### Installing the Game

1. Start Windows 95/98.
2. Insert the *Field & Stream*® *Trophy Buck* CD into the CD-ROM drive.
3. When the Install window appears, click on **INSTALL** and follow the on-screen instructions. (If the Install window does not appear, start Install by double-clicking **Autorun** on the *Trophy Buck* CD.)

### Starting the Game

1. Start Windows 95/98.
2. Insert the *Field & Stream*® *Trophy Buck* CD into the CD-ROM drive.
3. When the Autorun window appears, click on **RUN** to start the game. (You can also start it from the Sierra folder by double-clicking the game icon.)

### Additional Setup Help

During Installation, TEST SYSTEM checks to make sure your computer can run the game. If you still have trouble installing or

starting *Field & Stream® Trophy Buck* first check the Setup Help file. To do this, open the Sierra folder on the CD, then click **sutil32.hlp**. Search the Table of Contents to find help on your specific system component or problem. Additional information may be found in the Trophy Buck **README** file.

Users with Internet access can select **SIERRA WEBPAGE** from the Setup screen to access customer support, frequently asked questions, and possible updates for *Field & Stream® Trophy Buck*. To access the Setup screen after installation click Sierra Utilities from the Start menu.

## Multiplayer Game Setup

*Field & Stream® Trophy Buck* supports two “remote” multiplayer game options. To use either of these options, each player must have the *Field & Stream® Trophy Buck* CD installed and in the CD drive, as well as the appropriate hardware:

**Network Play:** All players need to be connected to the same local area network (LAN), and on the same fileserver and subnet. *Field & Stream® Trophy Buck* supports TCP/IP network protocol.

**Internet Play:** Each player needs an Internet browser that runs under Windows 95/98, and Internet access via modem or network.

## Field & Stream® Trophy Buck™ Overview

This section briefly introduces the game's main features. See the online Preview and Help in the game for complete information.

*Field & Stream® Trophy Buck* is a deer hunting simulation based on real locations, real outdoor conditions, and real deer behavior. To succeed, you will need to consider the weather, season, ground conditions, and many other factors that affect how real deer act. What you learn by playing *Field & Stream® Trophy Buck*, hearing the pro's Tips, and reading the “How To” multimedia deer hunting reference will be equally useful on real hunting trips...and vice versa.

If you have already mastered the basic how-to's of deer hunting, you'll find plenty of new challenges in hunting the Medium and Hard skill levels, or Tournament hunting against the computer. The ultimate challenge is Tournament hunting against other expert hunters over a local area network, or on the Internet.

## Getting Started

If you're new to *Field & Stream® Trophy Buck* you can select “Preview” on the Main Menu for a guided tour of the game.

To start hunting right away, select “Quick Hunt” from the Main Menu. This takes you to the firearm selection screen and then straight

into the woods with everything you'll need. Press F1 or click Help for quick information on how to navigate, find deer, and other topics.

To explore different skill levels, areas, and weather conditions, choose "Single Player" from the Main Menu. Then select "Hunting Trip" and choose the settings you want.

When you're ready for more of a challenge, Single-Player Tournaments pit you against simulated Pro opponents and tougher conditions. You'll need to have a pretty good grasp of the game's hunting controls, deer behavior, and gear selection to be competitive here. Try the pro's "Tips" or "How To" for hints.

"Career" mode allows a player to hunt with a different firearm over a series of seasons. Each season consists of a one-day hunt in each of the eight hunting areas with the same firearm. Your Boone and Crockett scores are totaled for each season and a running career total is displayed to allow you to track your improvement over time.

The greatest test of your skills is Multiplayer games with human opponents over a network, or the World Opponent Network (won.net) Internet server. Tournaments are fast and frenzied contests where every hour counts. Weigh in with a prize trophy buck, and the bragging rights are all yours... at least until the next game starts.

## Hunting Controls Quick Reference

### 1. General Controls

Esc .....	Exits Current Game
F1 .....	Help
F2 .....	Options
F3 .....	Truck Screen
F4 .....	Tips
F5 .....	Inventory Item #1
F6 .....	Inventory Item #2
F7 .....	Inventory Item #3
Space Bar .....	Raises Firearm
Ctrl .....	Fires Firearm
Page Up .....	Look Up
Page Down .....	Look Down

There are two different modes when you're out on a hunting trip: Walking mode, just as it says, is when you're moving about the 3D hunting areas. In order to enter Shooting mode and raise your firearm, press the Spacebar or click the Raise Firearm icon on the Inventory toolbar. Then you can aim and take your shot by pressing the Control key. It's important to remember that you can't walk while in shooting mode especially because it's an unsafe hunting practice.

## 2. Keyboard Controls: Walking Mode

Up Arrow .....Walk Forward

SHIFT+Up Arrow .....Run Forward

ALT+Up Arrow .....Sneak Forward

Down Arrow .....Walk Backward

SHIFT+Down Arrow .....Run Backward

ALT+Down Arrow .....Sneak Backward

Left Arrow.....Turn Left - Large Increments

SHIFT+Left Arrow .....Turn Left - Small Increments

ALT+Left Arrow .....Sidestep Left

Right Arrow .....Turn Right - Large Increments

SHIFT+Right Arrow .....Turn Right - Small Increments

ALT+Right Arrow .....Sidestep Right

## 3. Keyboard Controls: Shooting Mode

To enter shooting mode, press the spacebar.

Up Arrow .....Aim Higher - Large Increments

ALT+Up Arrow .....Aim Higher - Small Increments

Down Arrow .....Aim Lower - Large Increments

ALT+Down Arrow .....Aim Lower - Small Increments

Left Arrow.....Aim Left - Large Increments

SHIFT+Left Arrow .....Aim Left - Small Increments

Right Arrow .....Aim Right - Large Increments

SHIFT+Right Arrow .....Aim Right - Small Increments

### 3. Mouse Controls: Walking and Shooting Mode

To move throughout the 3D world using your mouse, simply left click in the 3D window and the cursor will disappear. To move forward, push the mouse forward. To turn left or right just slide the mouse to either direction. To go backward, (you guessed it) pull back on the mouse.

While in mouse movement mode, you can raise and lower the firearm by right clicking on the mouse. While the firearm is raised, you can fire by left clicking on the mouse. To click on any interface buttons (such as inventory items or the Deer Finder button) you must lower the firearm (right click) and then left click. The cursor will reappear which you can then use to select the appropriate button. Simply left click on the 3D window again to return to mouse movement mode. It becomes quite simple after a short time.
